Rev. Dr. L. Dianne Faust is an Associate Minister at the Historic Grace Baptist Church of Germantown, and is the Director of Community Engagement and Social Concerns. She is the President of Philadelphia Life Enrichment Center, a nonprofit that designs and develops Memory Cafés in sacred spaces for people experiencing dementia. Currently, she serves as an Advisory Board Member-University of Penn-Memory Care Center with principal investigators, Dr. David Wolk, and Dr. Jason Karlawish.

Rev. Faust was licensed to preach in 2018 at Mother Bethel AME Church. In January 2024 she affiliated with PEKBA (Philadelphia Eastern Keystone Baptist Association).
